Good quality studies on primary care epidemiology, with a longitudinal perspective, and data collected referring to reasons for encounter/episodes of care, also aiming to understand the social, cultural and environmental circumstances and their effect on health



## A whole list of list of recommendations for appropriate methodologies for future research in GP/FM

F.i. Longitudinal studies are important to assess continuous, comprehensive care and sustainability of intervention effects

or

Studies should measure relevant health outcomes or quality of life instead of only focussing on patient satisfaction, service uptake, or surrogate (bio-)markers.





- Increasing number of Special Interest Groups
- EGPRN should stay generalist, with an overview, focus methodology, in addition to producing knowledge
- Combine 3 dimensions
   Focused theme (i.e. Diabetes or muskuloskeletal dis.)
   Methodology (i.e. Focus on outcome measures or mixed method research)
   Generic theme (i.e. Equity, continuity, patientcentredness) related to the Research agenda
